

Auckland Community Pharmacies are now being profiled on www.healthpoint.co.nz



The three Metro Auckland DHBs are supporting all community pharmacies within the region to profile their professional pharmacy services on the new pharmacy section of www.healthpoint.co.nz

Community pharmacies are often the first health professional contact for many patients. Services provided by community pharmacies are varied and while there are common services provided by most community pharmacies, there are often some differences.

Those professional services profiled include the following amongst others:

- smoking cessation service
- aseptic dispensing
- clozapine dispensing
- community pharmacy anticoagulant management service
- long-term conditions (LTC) service
- medicines use review service (MURS)

- methadone dispensing
- emergency contraceptive pill (ECP)
- influenza vaccines
- needle exchange
- trimethoprim dispensing

A webpage has been developed for each pharmacy and once this has been reviewed and approved is put live on the Healthpoint site. Each pharmacy page is accessible by interactive map, key word search or `browse' by suburb. This is a great resource for GPs to refer patients to the nearest pharmacy which meets a specific need for them.


Over 200,000 people per month are using www.healthpoint.co.nz to access health service information. This is an easy way for pharmacy to have a significant web presence within the community.

Focus Radiotherapy is proud to have introduced Intrabeam single dose radiotherapy for breast cancer to New Zealand to replace the 3-6 weeks of daily radiotherapy in 30% of breast cancer patients. This is not a new technology; used in 1995 initially for brain malignancy and expanded to the breast in 1998. The evidence for its use is from the *Lancet* published Targit A Trial of over 3,500 women randomised in 33 centres in 11 countries. It showed this treatment to be non-inferior to the standard with it favoured in the following analyses: side-effect profile, toxicity, cosmesis, cost-benefit and patient preference. The key to its use is patient selection: women >45 years, solitary tumour <3 cm, grade 1 or 2, node negative and estrogen receptor positive.







GP training up-skilling at Auckland DHB

Alliance Agreement

Auckland-Waitemata DHBs have signed a Health Alliance agreement for primary care. Deputy Director of Funding Tim Wood says all signatories believe it will lead to significant improvements in services for enrolled patients. In addition, Tim sees this as a strengthening of the relationships between Mana Whenua and Mataawaka organisations, the Boards and PHOs. The plan, at a high level, is to drive improvement by:

- creating the conditions for patient and whanau-determined care through the locality approach
- increase integration of services and social services building capability and capacity across the sector supporting, where appropriate, infrastructure development within primary care
- reducing health inequalities through a reorientation of the sector
- supporting clinical governance through engagement with clinicians and design of services and change processes
- driving performance through quality improvement, transparent reporting and effective mechanisms for public accountability.

Northland DHB



Over the last few months there have been a few updates to the material on the various sites:

- 1. update on the DEXA criteria making it clear that repeat DEXA requests need to be discussed with a geriatrician prior to request
- guidance on risk assessment and management of patients with a family history of breast cancer.

Based on feedback we will be working on making the options for vasectomy available on the urology site given there is no publicly funded service.

With the advent of a new drug for managing MS we will work with Nicole McGrath to develop guidelines and when to consider these and how to access them.

If there are other gaps in information on hospital services, please let us know so we can address them.

We do see a steady stream of eReferrals coming in to the wrong service. These appear to largely be from locums so can we ask that you orientate them to the local Northland services. Ensuring they can access Healthpoint and know where to find information to guide their hospital referrals would prevent delays in patient care.

Counties Manukau Health bio-containment facility

CM Health has established a bio-containment facility to treat and contain highly infectious diseases, following international concern about the latest outbreak of Ebola virus disease.

While the risk to New Zealand from Ebola remains unlikely but possible, CM Health has worked with the Ministry of Health, Auckland Regional Public Health Service, other DHBs and primary care to develop a comprehensive plan to respond to any suspected case of Ebola in a traveller arriving from overseas, or family or friend who has had close contact with a traveller.

The team at CM Health has expertise in treating serious infectious diseases, and staff are trained and prepared to care for patients in the unlikely event of an Ebola case presenting to Middlemore Hospital.

Services undergoing a complete information review

As a regional service Community Alcohol and Drug Services (CADs) information for referrers and the public has undergone a complete review with significant changes. The new information will outline more clearly service expectations, deliverables and referral criteria and a number of GP resources.

Specific service information has been split into the following: CADs Counselling Services, CADs Medical Detoxification Services, CADs Auckland Opiate Treatment Service and CADs Altered High Youth Services.

There are also great resources and information available for medical professionals including:

Alcohol and other drug resource kit

Patient presenting to GP requesting support to withdraw from alcohol

Alcohol abuse - assessment

Alcohol screening tools

MOH legal requirements for prescribing and other.

The Elective Surgery Centre (ESC) at North Shore Hospital has also updated information on what they provide, access criteria and general information for the public.

Northern Region Fertility Service

The Northern Region Fertility Service (NRFS) provides coordination of referrals for funded fertility services for the Northern Region publicly (Auckland, Waitemata, Counties Manukau and Northland region).

From May 1st 2014, there were three providers of publicly funded fertility services in the Northern Region.

These are:

- Fertility Plus
- Repromed
- Fertility Associates

The three facilities offer a range of specialist Assisted Reproductive Technology (ART) assessment and treatment. If you have patients who would benefit from and are eligible for this service please go to the service page on Healthpoint for all the referral criteria and expectations.

Heavy Menstrual Bleeding (HMB)

HMB is excessive menstrual loss (around 20% of women) that interferes with a woman's physical, social, emotional and / or material quality of life. There are several effective treatment options available so it is ethically and medico-legally appropriate to discuss these. A woman's perception of the disruption her HMB causes is the important determinant of subsequent treatment.

Causes can be physical (endometrial polyps, fibroids, adenomyosis and most importantly but least commonly, malignancy and hyperplasia). Non-physical causes include dysfunctional hormonal cycles (the overall commonest cause), coagulopathies and iatrogenic (e.g. copper IUCD). A history (including severity, erratic versus regular bleeding and other symptoms including postcoital and intermenstrual bleeding) and a bimanual and speculum exam are useful to plan subsequent management.

USEFUL TESTS

- FBC & ferritin (eligible for Pharmac Mirena if Hb <120 or ferritin <16)
- HCG if pregnancy possible / suspected
- tests for PCOS if suspected
- coagulation tests and / or TFTs if suspected
- current smear.

RISK FACTORS FOR ENDOMETRIAL HYPERPLASIA

- obesity
- age over 45 years
- nullipara
- PCOS
- unopposed oestrogen therapy / Tamoxifen
- FH of endometrial cancer.

REFER TO GYNAECOLOGY

- where 3 months of medical treatment for above patients has failed
- any irregular or erratic bleeding
- uterus size greater than 12/40 (needs USS if any pelvic mass)
- significant anaemia
- risk factors for endometrial hyperplasia (see other table)
- endometrial thickness on scan > 12mm
- fibroid(s) >3cm.

WHO CAN BE MANAGED IN GENERAL PRACTICE?

- these patients don't need endometrial biopsy or scan before medical treatment
- regular cycle
- normal uterine size on examination
- no risk factors for endometrial hyperplasia (see other table).

MEDICAL TREATMENTS

- Iron therapy.
- Cyclical Tranexamic Acid (1-1.5g QDS for up to 5 days of menses) +/- NSAID.
- COCP.
- Provera 10mg TDS for 3 weeks then taper every 3rd day (effective at stopping very heavy bleeding).
- The LNG-IUS (Mirena) is an efficacious reversible contraceptive device. It generally offers satisfaction rates for treatment of HMB in up to 80% with around 20% amenorrhoea at one year. Women can have 3-6 months of irregular bleeding / light spotting). Side effects include weight gain, depression, acne, and headaches. Overall a reasonably well-tolerated low invasive treatment option for women with uteri smaller than 12/40.

HYSTERECTOMY

 Hysterectomy eliminates HMB and is also indicated for large fibroids and endometrial cancer. Whilst normal ovaries are usually conserved at hysterectomy, there is a small risk of premature menopause and possibly a small increased risk of prolapse.
 The surgery is major in nature and involves a 2-4 day stay with 4-6 weeks for full recovery on average. (If submucous fibroids are the cause these can be resected hysteroscopically).

NOVASURE ABLATION

• This is an impedance-limited (safety mechanism) radio-frequency thermal endometrial ablation (usually as a day case under GA in NZ). Suitable patients have a thorough evaluation including hysteroscopy D and C at the time and a relatively normal sized uterus. No further pregnancies should be planned as these can implant on the myometrium leading to complications. Future contraception is needed (e.g. condoms, vasectomy or concurrent tubal ligation). Over 2 million procedures have been performed worldwide and the 5-year satisfaction rate is above 90% with amenorrhoea in up to 75% of women. Contraindications include previous classical caesarean section or incisional myomectomy. Side effects include cramping for 1-2 days and a thin watery discharge for a few weeks. Complications such as thermal bowel injury are rare, estimated to be less than 1 in 10,000.









CONCLUSION

Management is not always straightforward but if in doubt always consider a transvaginal USS and possible referral. A pipelle biopsy can be of use
