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

Community Health Services and Social Service organisations are now being profiled on www.healthpoint.co.nz



In a pilot project, Counties Manukau Health is supporting and funding organisations in their region to be profiled on the new social services section of www.healthpoint.co.nz. Social services are services provided by the government for the welfare of the population. It is important that these services are profiled because there is a recognition of how important it is to address social issues to improve health outcomes. Information about services offered is an effective way to make the link. The types of services that are profiled include: abuse and violence, advocacy, basic needs, cultural support, education and training, employment, legal/civil services and social work.

In the second pilot project Waitemata and Auckland DHBs are supporting and funding organisations in their region to be profiled on the new community health services section.

These services include abuse and violence, advocacy, addictions, counselling, end of life care, healthy lifestyle, home support, injury or disability, screening and prevention and transport.







Regional News



The four northern region DHBs have a group of clinicians from primary and secondary care who have agreed on best practice clinical pathways for a number of diseases/illnesses. These are the Northern Regional Clinical Pathways.

These pathways are presented via the clinical decision support tool Nexxt™ with the aim to ensure they are quick and easy to use by enabling them to be included in doctor's workflow via their PMS.

What does Nexxt do?

Nexxt is a patient's personalised pathway that is easy to use and share. Nexxt is a clinical decision support tool which makes a clinical pathway patient-specific and usable in real time. Nexxt is incorporated into a clinician's PMS and makes the information of a clinical pathway accessible as part of a patient consultation. It provides each patient with their own dynamic version of the pathway, one that records actions taken and treatments given and suggests the next step in treatment or referral according to current best practice guidelines. Nexxt aims to help clinicians provide better, more consistent care for their patients and for patients to have immediate knowledge of, and input into, that care.

Nexxt:

- Is patient specific
- Is usable inside a consultation, within the PMS
- Is able to be picked up at following consultations
- Suggests next review, treatment or referral action based on current best practice
- Autofills patient information
- Writes treatment notes back into the PMS

Currently in the health system there is no single, consistent and recommended approach to care and different practitioners are following different guidelines. Nexxt is designed to remedy this, to be used primarily in primary care settings to help doctors and practice nurses in clinical decision making, based on current best practice methods. Nexxt is an absolute replication of a clinical pathway/algorithm, presenting it in a flow for a specific patient, taking what was once a static pathway and making it interactive.

Currently Nexxt is being rolled out to practices in the Auckland/Northland region and we are providing full training and support to the doctors and nurses using Nexxt. The implementation will be gradual and will support hospital systems, ereferral and shared care platforms in the future.

The goal is to enable evidenced based best practice guidelines which will provide confidence in achieving optimal treatment in both primary and secondary care.



Changes to Community Neurobehavioural Services

The Ministry of Health is implementing a single national provider of specialist Behaviour Support Service (BSS). The sole contracting organisation for BSS is now Explore – a division of Healthcare of New Zealand Holdings Limited (HHL Group). This transition is in its final stage with the transfer of clients currently supported by the Community Neurobehavioural Service (CNS) to Explore. From 1 April, 2015 Explore will assume clinical responsibility for all new referrals for BSS. Advisory to Primary Care

Enhanced Adult Hand Services at North Shore Hospital

From 1 March 2015, Waitemata District Health Board (DHB) will be enhancing local acute hand services for our <u>adult</u> population at North Shore Hospital.

From this date, please be advised that Waitemata DHB will have additional resources in place to manage the majority of acute hand conditions (excluding potential replants, flexor tendons and nerves) for the local adult population.

All acute hand adult referrals, with the exceptions of the cases above, are to be referred to the on-call orthopaedic registrar at North Shore Hospital.

If clinically necessary, the Waitemata Orthopaedic service will refer patients to the Auckland Regional Centre for Plastic and Hand Surgery at Counties Manukau Health.

There is no change to the existing arrangements for children.

Northland DHB



With the beginning of the new year, Win and I have embarked on

a program to ensure twice yearly full reviews of the clinical information on the Healthpoint sites, with a clinical lead.

We hope this will ensure up to date information that is expanded as the need arises from either the primary or secondary care perspective.

Changes to date on the sites:

Gynaecology:

Change in recommendation for investigation of menorrhagia with no irregular bleeding: patients require either a pipelle or USS, both no longer recommended.

Coming soon: menorraghia assessment and management guideline.

Neurology:

Expanded guideline on steroid use for acute disabling MS attacks.

New guideline for funded MS prevention treatment.

Removal of chronic headache with no red flags as a condition accepted for clinic assessment. Guideline on primary care management on the site.

Colposcopy:

Expanded colposcopy guideline to cover recommendations for smears showing high risk HPV.

HPV FAQs to assist with discussions around vaccination.

Diabetes Service:

New one page guide on insulin management for patients with type 2 diabetes.

Older Peoples Health:

New information to guide referral for NASC assessment for the under 65yrs.

Mental Health Services:

Addition of the acute referral process; phone call to the Crisis team followed by eReferral using the mental health and addictions eReferral (not the Acute).

A tidy up of the contact information to make is easier to use.

Radiology:

Addition of information to guide nephrostomy tube replacement.

GPL site:

The first quarterly report of actual waiting times for routine appointments. Each quarter an updated report will be added to the site as well as emailed to the practice managers. This has been added at the request of Dr Nick Chamberlain, CEO, to enable informed discussion at the time of referral.

Oncology Unit:

This site has been renamed to the Cancer and Blood Service which more accurately reflects the service provided. There is not a lot of information on this site at present and we would welcome input as to what information you would find helpful.

The Respiratory site is under review as we speak, any changes we make will be notified in the next issue as well as in our local newsletter to you.

As always, any information you think is missing or incorrect, please let us know so we can address this.
